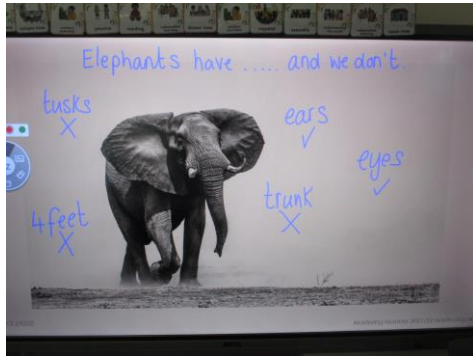

In Seedlings our Maths work has focused on deconstructing into parts. To start with we had lots of discussions about parts and whole. We used toys that can be taken apart and



put back together and some that can not to prove the point that items are made of parts that make a whole just like numbers. Moving on we used our bodies to continue to illustrate the concept using



the stem sentence; "My..... is a part of me and the whole of me is (child's name)" We also looked at the different parts of an animal and what animals have that we don't To complete the week we used Numberblocks to support the decomposition of 2 and 3. Talking about the parts that make up the numbers; 1 and 1, 2 and 1 or 1 and 1 and 1

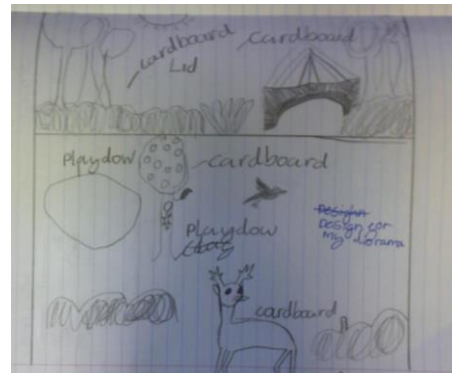
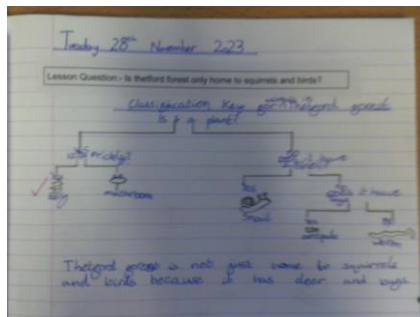

### Message from Mrs Peach - Juniper Class

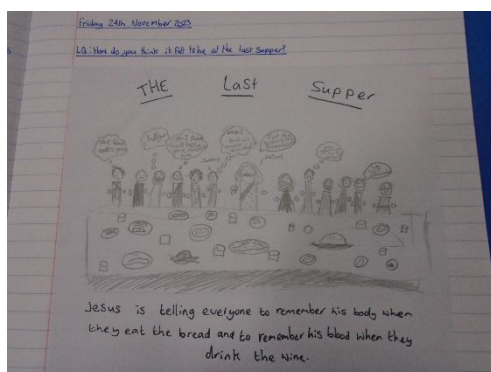
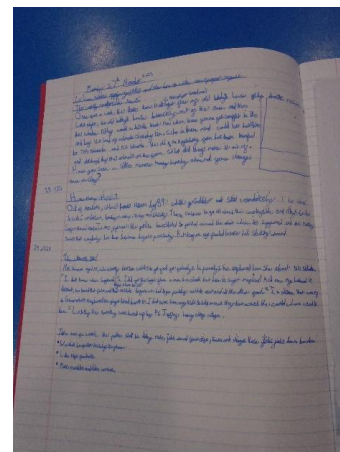
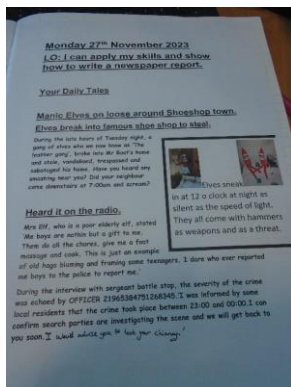
